

Husband of Helen Alice Wilson

Axel Johannas Rosenquist was the husband of **Helen Alice Wilson** who survived the sinking of the Titanic, the following information gives brief details of how their lives continued after the disaster in 1912. It appears that the sinking of the Titanic did not stop Axel Rosenquist from completing 35 years service as a sea captain.
