LONDON, March 22--J. Pierpont Morgan was one of the passengers who landed this morning from the White Star liner Baltic.

A newspaper man who also crossed on the Baltic tells me that he tried in vain to get Mr. Morgan to talk for publication about the Wall Street flurry. The most that Mr. Morgan said to anybody he said to an Englishman who expressed his fears concerning American railway stocks.

"You will change your mind," Mr. Morgan quietly remarked.

Mr. Morgan spent the day in Liverpool and witnessed the Grand Steeplechase.

Mr. Morgan denied the current rumor that he had come to Europe in order to attend a conference on the subject of the North Atlantic passenger business, regarding which negotiations are at present proceeding.
