Of the eight or 10 ships that have never been heard of after putting to sea in the 80 years or so since trans-Atlantic steam navigation began, it is believed that most, if not all, met their fate against icebergs. Among the most famous of these was the Inman liner *Glasgow*

The nearest approach in modern marine history to the dimensions of the present catastrophe were the loss of the steamer in 1873 when 574 lives were lost, and that of *La Bourgogne* in 1898, with a list of fatalities of 571. The earlier disaster of the *Great Eastern*
