Harry Anderson, Commodore of N. Y. A. C. Yacht Unit, Was 87

WHITE PLAINS, N. Y., Nov. 24---Harry Anderson, a survivor of the sinking of the White Star liner Titanic in 1912, died yesterday in the New Rochelle Hospital. His age was 87.

Mr. Anderson was commodore of the yacht division of the New York Athletic Club for a number of years and in later years he was a member of the Larchmont Yacht Club.

He retired several years ago from a Wall Street brokerage firm and lived in Pelham Manor. He was born in England and came to the United States in his youth. His wife, the former Florence Makley, died several years ago. Mr. Anderson had no surviving relatives in the United States.
